New hotel brings 800 jobs to South Bank

Open Day on 1 October to encourage residents to apply

All eyes have been on the Westminster Bridge roundabout during its metamorphosis from a graffiti-ridden eyesore into London's biggest new build hotel for over 100 years. Opening in early 2010, the Park Plaza Westminster Bridge hotel will employ around 800 people and is working with Waterloo Job Shop to encourage local residents to apply for jobs. Positions are available with many teams including housekeeping, security, maintenance, meetings and events and front of house.

An Open Day on 1 October (information sessions run every hour from 3pm to 7pm) at the Lilian Baylis Community Hub in Kennington will provide the chance to hear more about the opportunities, including the potential for career progression. Waterloo Job Shop will be helping residents with CVs and interview techniques.

The arrival of the hotel will bring a signature restaurant, sushi bar, coffee shop and patisserie counter to this once blighted corner.

A new future for historic streets

New state of the art pitch at Lilian Baylis Community Hub

Residents of all ages can now enjoy year-round access to one of the best football pitches in London. The FIFA and UEFA approved pitch opened to play in August at the Lilian Baylis Community Hub. To celebrate the occasion, thirty-six teams of children and young people from Lambeth, Southwark and Croydon competed in a friendly 5-a-side tournament.

Sport Action Zone works to address the lack of sports activities and facilities in the area and through their partnership with Nike, which included a generous £80k contribution, has secured this fantastic asset for the neighbourhood. The pitch itself incorporates Nike Grind, a sports surface made of recycled trainers.

A corporate Power League will launch later in the year to help fundraise for further improvements to the site.

Waterloo FC is enjoying a summer of success with several wins under their belt. The Under 15s team have scooped the Tandridge League Cup whilst the Under 11s have won their league. Not to be trumped, the Under 12s squad has been busy on a sports tour, supported by funding from the London Eye. It will come as no surprise to learn that they too were hailed as the champions. Waterloo FC has recently moved to the Lilian Baylis Community Hub in order to take advantage of the facilities on offer and has created a new communal space where young people can meet and socialise, thanks to a It's Your Community Award from O2 as well as a grant from Lambeth's Ward Purse. The Club's ambitions don't stop there however. It is extending its international links and has taken up the challenge of working with a French-speaking squad in a deprived neighbourhood in Togo. The country is known as the home of Manchester City player Emmanuel Adebayor and it is hoped that with their support the small grassroots club can develop some fresh talent.

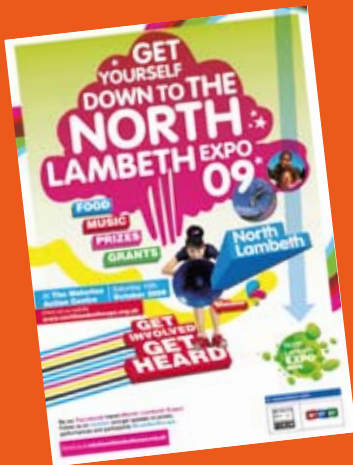
